Anna Collard, founder and managing director of Popcorn Training, gives some more detail on her Strategy Talk: "Certain personality traits make people more or less likely to fall prey to specific cyber attacks or scams. In my talk I'll explore the ways in which different traits

influence online behaviour, and how security teams can apply this knowledge to their culture and awareness programmes. A deeper understanding of why users behave as they do can also be drawn on to increase user engagement and buy-in.”

A new highlight for 2019 is [FutureSec](#) – a special programme looking at next generation information security through the lens of people and innovation. Sessions will cover topics including developing careers, building skillsets to meet the demands of the digital business, attracting and retaining talent, and diversity.

Victoria Windsor, Group Content Manager at [Infosecurity Group](#), says: “Strengthening an organisation’s security posture must be a holistic process that addresses the people dimension as well as technology. One of our priorities for Infosecurity Europe this year was to support the industry in this area. Not only are security functions under pressure to field teams of increasingly highly skilled professionals – they also need to bring the entire business along on the security journey. This involves education and culture change, extending engagement to data-heavy functions like marketing and finance, but also to all employees who handle data and use systems and devices. In short, that’s everybody!”
